

CARP-ID



CHOR Youth & Family Services Community Accountability and Recidivism Prevention-Intensive Diversion Program (CARP-ID) offers specialized Case Management and Forensic Counseling to youth who have been adjudicated for sexually offensive or sexually problematic behaviors requiring intensive sexual offense-specific community-based treatment as an alternative to placement in a residential treatment facility or other residential setting.

CARP-ID is designed to provide ongoing monitoring, treatment, and assessment within the context of a level system. Youth (ages 12-21) complete 12 months of case management and therapeutic services to avoid residential placement, to improve their quality of living, while promoting community safety. CARP-ID incorporates the principles of evidence-based practices in order to appropriately identify individual service needs. CARP-ID relies on the findings of the Youth Level of Service Inventory (YLS) as conducted by the referring Juvenile Probation Officer to identify the risks/needs of each referred client. Upon receiving a referral, the YLS is reviewed and referenced to assist in service and goal development. Youth and families are assisted in cultivating connections to needed community support services.

ANTICIPATED TIMELINE

1-6 Months

- Monitoring of established treatment goals
- Two face-to-face meetings/week with Case Manager
- Sexual history Clinical Polygraph (within first 3-4 months)
- Progress review meeting by month six
- Six-month risk assessment
- One face-to-face meeting/week with Therapist (Addressing identified risks and history of engaging in criminal sexual behavior)

6-9 Months

- Continuation of adjustment monitoring
- One face-to-face meeting/week with Case Manager
- One face-to-face meeting/week with Therapist
- Maintenance Clinical Polygraph (as deemed appropriate by Treatment Team)
- Continued assessment of progress toward achievement of program goals and compliance with CARP-ID and probation expectations

9-12 Months

- Continuation of adjustment monitoring
- One face-to-face meeting/week with Case Manager
- Maintenance Clinical Polygraph (as deemed appropriate by Treatment Team)
- Case Manager will help juvenile and family connect to community resources
- Assessment of progress to determine if discharge from therapy is advised (Achievement of goals, compliance with CARP-ID and probation, successful completion of polygraphy, and a reduction of overall risk will warrant a recommendation of discharge)
Note: If ongoing sex-offender-specific concerns/risks remain, it may be recommended that ongoing CARP-ID involvement continue

CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

- ✓ Adolescent males and females between the ages of 12 to 21 years of age
- ✓ Juveniles who have committed sexual offenses
- ✓ Juveniles who are adjudicated delinquent or dependent
- ✓ Adjudicated delinquent and placed on juvenile probation and/or released from residential facilities
- ✓ Juveniles who demonstrate elevated risk as indicated on the YLS
- ✓ Juveniles who present with co-occurring issues; (i.e. criminogenic risk/need and mental health concerns)
- ✓ Youth with an IQ of 70 or above
- ✓ *Rule Out: Youth with active psychosis, homicidal or suicidal ideation*

TARGETED SERVICES PROVIDED

- Initial individualized assessment of functional status and risk
- Development of transition and safety plans
- Family Interventions
- Ongoing Assessment
- Behavior Contracts
- Case Management meetings/weekly with dosage determined by needs and time in the program
- Parental or Guardian Involvement
- Weekly face-to-face therapeutic services (until month 9, unless deemed clinically necessary)
- Prosocial Activities
- Detailed monthly progress reports
- Transportation Assistance
- 24-hour On-call Service

ASSESSMENTS

- YLS (*initial and six month*)
- BASC-3 (*pre and post*)
- PROFESOR (*pre and post*)
- Risk Assessment to determine Sexual Risk
- Clinical Polygraph (*sexual history and maintenance as needed*)

PROGRAM LENGTH

While CARP-ID is typically a twelve-month program, it can be extended if needed.
