

RAMP

CHOR Youth & Family Services-Ravenhill Accountability and Mentoring Program (RAMP) is a six-month (26 week) empirically evaluated (SPEP'ed) mentoring program for youth (ages 10-21) who are adjudicated delinquent and are living in or returning to the community. RAMP provides intensive mentoring and therapeutic services to at-risk juveniles residing in the community. Juvenile Offenders who are Adjudicated Delinquent often require services and support to promote wellness, improved social functioning, positive family interactions, and decision-making to reduce the likelihood of recidivating.

From the onset of involvement, discharge planning evolves. This involves clarification of specific goals that need to be accomplished, and the identification and coordination of ancillary community resources that can be accessed for additional support and opportunities (mental health clinics, employment assistance, educational resources, and pro social activities).

Mentors and Therapists will meet with the Juvenile Offender in order to assist in the development of appropriate competencies, including but not limited to:

- Decision-making Skills
- Pro-social Skills
- Academic Skills
- Employment Skills
- Independent Living Skills
- Family-focused Meetings
- Therapeutic Interventions

THERAPY.....

Youth can meet face-to face with a Master's level therapist twice monthly per discretion of the Probation Officer and family. Therapists will provide services tailored towards (but not limited to) coping skills, emotional regulation, healthy relationships, anger management, and life skills.

HIGHLY TRAINED STAFF.....

Mentors are trained in: CBT related interventions, FDGM-like techniques, Motivational Interviewing, Stages of Change, and act as role models and meeting with each youth in the home, school, or community setting for at least one hour at a time, totaling three times per week. In addition mentors work with youth and their families to assist in developing competencies in decision making; pro-social skills; academic skills; aggression management, appropriate boundaries, respect in the home; employment skills and independent living skills. Mentors are on call on a 24-hour basis.

SERVICE PLANNING FROM THE ONSET OF INVOLVEMENT.....

An individual service plan will be collaboratively developed, capturing the unique needs of the juvenile and/or family, and will focus on the areas of "Personality and Behavior", "Attitudes and Orientation", and/or "Family Circumstances/ Parenting" identified through the YLS/CMI. Behavioral contracts will be created to reduce/eliminate identified problematic behaviors through the use of a reward system.

CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES.....

Case Management Services are offered to assist the Juvenile Offender and/or family to access additional community resources (financial assistance, mental health support, vocational training, employment, welfare and housing assistance, and drug and alcohol abuse prevention and psychoeducation (when applicable) to assist the juvenile and/or family with completing service goals, reducing stress, and improving function.

CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

- ✓ Adolescent males and females between the ages of 10 to 21 years of age
- ✓ Adjudicated delinquent and placed on juvenile probation and/or released from residential facilities
- ✓ Determined to be a moderate to high risk on the Youth Level of Service Case Management Inventory (YLS/CMI); and "Personality & Behavior," "Attitudes & Orientation," or "Family Circumstances/Parenting" are the identified criminogenic need
- ✓ Youth with an IQ of 70 or above
- ✓ *Rule Out: Youth with active psychosis, homicidal or suicidal ideation*

HIGHLY STRUCTURED INDIVIDUALIZED CURRICULA INCLUDING:

- 78 contact hours over 26 weeks
- Family Support
- Case Management Services
- Individual Therapy as needed to focus on:
 - Coping Skills
 - Emotional Regulation Skills
 - Healthy Relationship Skills
 - Anger Management
 - Life Skills
- Masters-level and Doctoral-level Clinicians
- Program Outcomes (*every 90 days*)
- Detailed monthly progress reports

FAMILY SERVICES

- Weekly Family Therapy
 - Family Interventions to deal with aggression in the home, appropriate boundaries, chore-charts when applicable and respect in the home
- Connections to Community Resources
- 24-hr/day on call
- Transportation Support
