

ENHANCED LEVEL OF CARE RESIDENTIAL

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CHOR Youth & Family Services **Enhanced Level of Care Residential** is an 8-bed program for 12-18 year old males who are in need of a more enhanced level of care, experiencing family conflict, or otherwise unable to remain in the community as a result of emotional, behavioral, or academic issues.

The philosophy of **CHORYFS's Residential Programs** is based on the belief that adolescents with psychiatric disorders should be treated in the least restrictive environment while maintaining community safety.

The program provides basic needs including shelter, food, clothing, personal hygiene products, medical and dental care. Youth benefit from an academic program that fits their needs including virtual learning, as well as on-campus classrooms. Outside the classroom, the program provides educational and enrichment opportunities through field trips, community service projects, and social activities. Group support, family meetings, and life/job skills training are also offered.

TREATMENT TEAM

- **Psychiatrist**-Evaluation within 7 days, medication management, monthly monitoring and 24-hour availability.
- **Master's Degree Clinician**-ratio 1:4. Facilitates Trauma Recovery Groups four times per week for 60 minutes, one-hour Family Therapy sessions, other clinician facilitated groups may address values clarification, boundaries, cognitive distortions, and healthy sexuality.
- **Bachelor's Degree Case Manager**-ratio 1:8. Meets with each youth for a minimum of one-hour on a weekly basis to provide age-appropriate life skills consultation.
- **Bachelor's Degree Supervisor II**-ratio 1:8.
- **Bachelor's Degree Youth Behavioral Specialist II**-ratio 1:1/1:2 (1st and 2nd shift); ratio 1:4 (3rd shifts). Provides safety, supervision, reinforcement and support of youth's individual treatment plan and the behavioral management system.



The Enhanced Level of Care Residential setting provides teens 24/7 supervision.

Trained staff support the youth using a trauma-informed approach.

CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

- ✓ Adolescent males between the ages of 12 and 18 years of age
- ✓ Youth in need of psychiatric care, intensive therapy, higher level of supervision, and medication management
- ✓ Youth with an IQ of 65 or above
- ✓ Youth who are experiencing family conflict of emotional, behavioral, academic, or issues

LENGTH OF STAY

The average length of stay in the Enhanced Service Treatment Residential program ranges from 6 to 9 months. However, the exact duration is determined by the treatment team to ensure the adolescent can successfully reintegrate into the community with the necessary support services in place.
