

SHORT-TERM RESIDENTIAL

UNIQUE CARE

CHOR Youth & Family Services **Short-Term Residential** is a 16 bed program for 12-18 year old males who are unhomed, experiencing family conflict, or otherwise unable to remain in the community as a result of emotional, behavioral, or academic issues.

The program provides basic needs including shelter, food, clothing, personal hygiene products, and medical/dental care. Youth benefit from an academic program that fits their needs including virtual learning, as well as on-campus classrooms. Outside the classroom, the program provides educational and enrichment opportunities through field trips, community service projects, and social activities. Group support, family meetings, and life/job skills training are also offered.

STAFF TRAINING

New Employee Development is inclusive of classroom and direct experience. Included in the training are modules covering the Sanctuary Model of Care, First aid/CPR, medication administration, and behavior shaping.

EDUCATION PROGRAM

We understand that school can be a huge stressor for many of our youth. We work closely with each child's teachers to find the best curriculum and setting (i.e., virtual, on-campus) to keep them on track and follow all IEP's. Our teachers work alongside other staff to ensure each child receives the attention and support needed to succeed academically.



The Short-Term Residential setting provides teens 24/7 supervision.

Trained staff support the youth using a trauma-informed approach.

CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

- ✓ Adolescent males between the ages of 12 and 18 years of age
- ✓ Youth with an adjudication of dependency or delinquency
- ✓ Youth with an IQ of 65 or above
- ✓ Youth who are homeless, experiencing family conflict, or otherwise unable to remain in the community as a result of emotional, behavioral, academic, or substance abuse issues

SERVICES PROVIDED

- 24-hour supervised, structured shelter
- Individualized Service Planning
- Case Management Services
- Psychological Services
(available upon request)
- Psychiatric Services
- Psychoeducation
- Educational Services
- Recreational Services
- Discharge and Aftercare Planning

LENGTH OF STAY

The average length of stay in the Short-Term Residential is 1 day-12 months and is dependent on a youth's reunification with their families or guardians, or the identification of stable, long-term care.
